BAYPORT STUDENTS INVENT FOR LOCAL SENIOR CITIZENS

Innovation and Invention is an Advanced Tech Ed course at Bay Port High School where students can pursue personal interests in technology. The students are members of the robotics teams within the class and had recently finished a competition and needed a project to work on. Their teachers, Mike Phillips and Blake Greisinger, wanted to challenge students to use what they learned programming robots and apply it to help the Howard-Suamico community. They contacted Sharon Sheedy at Brookview Meadows Assisted Living in Howard and asked to meet with some of their residents.

At the first meeting the residents were asked what they need in their daily life to be more mobile, safe or independent. They gave the students 25 different ideas from one-button use of technology, to an easy way to reach the tops shelf of a cabinet, to how to match socks for the visually impaired. At the second meeting the students pared down the list to five items that thought would most attainable with the resources they have available to them in the high school.

The next step for the students is to spend some time at Brookview Meadows to observe the actions of the residents and then move forward with one or two items. The students will work on their inventions for the remainder of this school year and continue into next school year. Project based learning activities are important skills for today's high school students. The skills the students learn trying to solve these problems will certainly prepare them for 21st century.
