- I. **Call to order – Jim Van Den Elzen called the meeting to order.**
Roll Call - Present: Devene Spence-Kolade, Early Fuller, Damian La Croix, Cheri Perrault, Paula Pyle, Jim VanDenElzen, Dave Wiese, Mike Anderson, Bob Strazishar, Jim Lewis, Aaron Wolf, and Sue VanDenElzen, Phil Bellis, Tracy Johnson, Adam H., Julie (GGB) Not Present: Gay Duclon,
- II. Secretary Report – Jim VanDenElzen presented meeting minutes from May 20th, 2010. Reviewed by board, and Motion made by Cheri Perrault to accept, with a seconded by Paula Pyle: Approved.
- III. Treasurer's Report – Devene Spence-Kolade presented the balance sheet and income statement for the period ending May 31, 2010. Motion to approve the Report as presented by Paula Pyle (as amended); seconded by Early Fuller; Approved.
- IV. School Report – Damian LaCroix
 - Taste of Village Event was a success. (\$15,000 raised which was up by \$3000 from 2009) Careful review and scheduling is in process for next year's event as there were several other community events occurring on the same evening this year.
 - Graduation went very well
 - Baseball State Championship Game is tonight at the Timber Rattler Stadium
 - Girls Soccer Game is tomorrow in Kimberly.
 - Presentation of "Bridging the Gap" video to share the communication to the community related to the 2 ½ to 3 million dollar gap that will occur in Nov. 2013. Key Message: We have been preparing and incorporating efficiencies for years in this school district – energy, lean processes etc. The tax payer revenue is utilized effectively and continues to be a solid investment as it returns productive employees to the community and employer base in the Howard Suamico District. ACTION: Any thoughts or feedback should be sent directly to Damian by email or phone.
- V. President Correspondence/Comments:
 - Thank You to Devene Spence-Kolade for her time with the board and treasurer position as this was her last meeting. Good Luck in your relocation and endeavors in Pittsburgh.

- 46 Single Family home permits were applied for YTD (as compared to 49 in 2009)

- 3 commercial permits to date – typically we would see 20-30/year.
- A large 204 Apartment complex is underway at Shawano and Hwy. C.
- Community Church is offering a Farmer's Market on Thursdays 3pm-9pm.
- July 17th is the Howard Community Event including several events like: Hot Air Balloon, Eagle III, Horse Drawn Carriage and Co-ed Softball tournament.
- We are in a selection process with firms related to a Comprehensive Plan for the Howard Area.
- Suamico: Adam H. reported:
 - 2010 permits YTD equal to all of 2009 – net new construction.
 - Oct. 2010 Hard Hat Luncheon for the new Festival Foods – they will be hiring 250 employees to open the store.
 - Summer Solstice coming up soon!
- Greater Green Bay Events: Julie reported
 - May: Cellcom, LZ Lambeau, Jehovah Witness Events
 - April: Occupancy was up
 - June: Bellin Run, Bay Fest, National Railroad Museum – Thomas the Train Event (Many requests on how to get to the NEW Zoo and Bay Beach at this event)
